Newman House News

Earlier in the year, the difficult decision had to be taken to close Newman House as the centre for the Catholic Chaplaincy. The condition of the building means that the only option is to sell it, as repair and maintenance costs are beyond what is affordable. Our focus now transfers to St Pauls' church on Lenton Boulevard as the centre to serve Catholic students at UoN and NTU. Work is being planned to adapt the facilities there to provide a chaplaincy centre for everyone to use. If you want to be part of the planning for this development, let Fr Joe know.
